Saginaw County students benefit from scholarships



Nearly 170 Saginaw County students received close to \$165,000 in scholarships from the Saginaw Community Foundation.

Students received awards at SCF's annual Excellence in Education Celebration on May 18 at The Castle Museum of Saginaw County History in Saginaw, where they met with donors in a private reception prior to the ceremony. Breannah Alexander, a Grand Valley State University freshman and a 2008 SCF scholarship recipient, was the guest speaker. Alexander was also a member of the Foundation's Youth Advisory Board, FORCE, while attending high school in

Saginaw.

"The Saginaw Community Foundation is extremely proud of all the

students who received any of the Foundation's scholarships. They exemplify a sampling of the caliber of students we have in our community," said Renee Johnston, president and chief executive officer of the Saginaw Community Foundation. "I am also proud that we are helping donors achieve their charitable wishes."

The event was co-sponsored by FORCE, Morgan Stanley Smith Barney and AHP Financial Services Inc., and was catered by dawn of a new day coffee house. Thanks to these sponsors and the generous use of the museum, costs for the event were kept to a minimal amount.

Youth First to receive \$2.25 million grant

Youth First will receive a \$2.25 million grant from the Michigan Department of Education to help support after-school programming in Saginaw County.

The initiative of the Saginaw Community Foundation will use the 21st Century Community Learning Centers grant to expand its free after-school programming from two to three sites across Saginaw County. The new sites include Henry Doerr Child Development Center in Saginaw and Martin G. Atkins Elementary School in Bridgeport Township. The program currently operates at Carrollton Elementary School in Carrollton Township and C.C. Coulter Elementary School in Saginaw. Each site will receive approximately \$150,000 annually for five years.

In addition to the 21st Century grant, the Wickes Foundation has agreed to privately support a new program at Merrill Elementary School in Merrill.

Japanese Cultural Center receives \$10,000 from SCF

The Japanese Cultural Center and Tea House of Saginaw received a \$10,000 grant from the Saginaw Community Foundation for the restoration of its ceremonial gate.

The nonprofit plans to restore the 100 ft. long gate to prepare for its 50th year celebration of Saginaw's sister city relationship with Tokushima, Japan, in 2011. In honor of the event, Tokushima will send a regal delegation for the commemoration.

CB Wealth Management and the Frank N. Andersen Foundation. It is also seeking additional donations from the community. Rodney Parrott, managing director of the Cultural Center, says he

expects to begin the restoration project in 2010.

"We need the old gate to be in perfect condition for the festivities," Parrot

said. "The grant we received from the Saginaw Community Foundation was essential to completing this project."

The Japanese Cultural Center and Tea House was one of eight organizations receiving a portion of \$42,611 from the Saginaw Community Foundation in its first-quarter grant cycle. The next grant cycle deadline is Thursday, October 1. SCF is focusing on the following areas for the October grant cycle: senior citizen projects; projects geared towards women, children and families; tobacco prevention; youth recreation; mental health; education to at-risk youth; health and human services; and helping the poor and needy persons of Saginaw County.


